St Bon's joint top primary school in Bristol

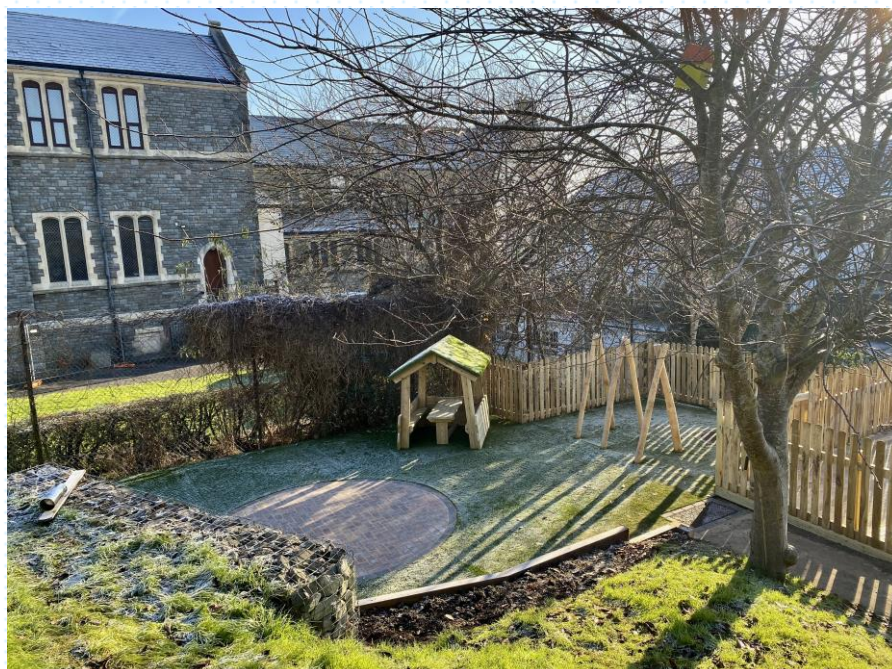

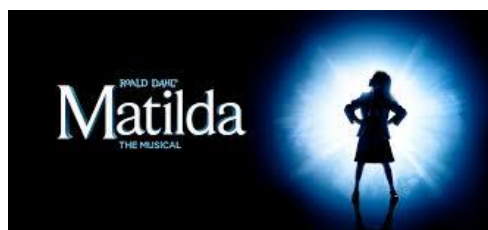

Love thy neighbour – putting our theme into action

Years 1 to 6 have all identified their own projects to support our Gospel theme “*Love thy Neighbour*” this term.

There is money still coming into school for some of the charities and Year 4 have set up a project to raise money for guide dogs for the blind.

Classes have also offered friendship to our neighbours through a coffee morning and carols for the residents of Egerton Road (3B) and visits to pre-school to read stories (Year 1). There have also been contributions from groups of pupils to the local food banks (6WA) and hygiene banks (3H).

Well done to everyone who has been involved in these projects to care for our local and global neighbours. Your efforts have made a big difference to the lives of others.
