Dear Parents and Carers,

Unfortunately our worst fears about access to school up Egerton Road came true this week. An ambulance had to be called for a poorly child – it took 20 minutes for it to reach school even though it was metres away from us on Egerton Road. This was due to the way that cars were parked and from school traffic not moving out of the way, despite the siren being on to alert drivers of an emergency situation.

If it had not been for one of the ambulance crew leaving the ambulance to run up to the school, along with a kind neighbour on Egerton Road who helped to carry the emergency equipment, there would have been a significant delay in the child receiving the assistance that was needed.

Please consider how you would feel if your child's life was at risk due to the slow reactions and thoughtlessness of others. We have repeatedly asked parents not to use Egerton Road for picking up or collecting children from school – it is extremely tight and often has very limited parking spaces anyway. The emergency services do have the right to smash windows in order to move vehicles if it is deemed necessary.

We have contacted Bishop Road school as well as we are aware that parents from that school also park locally. Please do look at our website which has some good advice about safer places to park.


New school meal prices from Term 2

We have been informed by Bristol City Council that, from after half term, school meals for children in years 3 – 6 will now cost £2.10. This is an increase of 5p on the current price. If your child is eligible for free school meals, this charge will not apply.
