School uniform

I have noticed that a number of children are coming to school in heavily logo'd sportswear. Please can I remind all parents and carers that pupils should come dressed in a navy sweatshirt or jumper. This doesn't not have to be a St Bon's logo jumper. On PE days your child should come to school in navy leggings, shorts or joggers. Again, I would ask that these are not heavily logo'd or branded.

Now the weather is becoming warmer I am asking pupils to remove all outdoor clothing whilst they are inside the building. This includes snoods and hats. Please remember our PTFA has a wonderful second-hand uniform rep who would be able to help you if you need additional school uniform.

Update on planned Industrial action

As you are aware, the National Education Union (NEU) has scheduled a series of planned strike days throughout March. The dates that will affect St Bonaventures are:

School swimming lessons

This year we have moved from Horfield Leisure Centre to Badminton School pool for our school swimming lessons. We now have exclusive use of the swimming pool at Badminton for the lunch hour. This enables our pupils to have a full 30 minutes in the water. We have been fortunate enough to secure a Penguin swimming teacher and a secondary school PE teacher who alongside the class teacher deliver high quality swimming lessons. The cost of transporting the children to and from the pool is included within the cost passed on to parents.

The quality of the teaching within the lesson is of a very high standard and focuses on technique which I have seen has had an impact on all pupils including the pupils who also attend a weekly lesson out of school. I am aware that the cost of school swimming lessons is a concern for some families. If you would like to discuss this further please do make an appointment to see me.

World Book Day

World book day falls on Thursday 2nd March which you will have seen is one of the planned strike days. To avoid any disruption, I have made the decision to celebrate World Book day in school on Friday 3rd March.

On Friday 3rd March we are inviting all pupils to come to school **dressed to express**. Children can come as their favorite book character or as a word which most represents them. This year, we want to give the children the opportunity to have fun and express themselves.

We would also like to arrange a book swap on this day and are therefore inviting all children to come to school with a book that they no longer want and are happy to swap for a new pre-loved book. Throughout the day, year groups will swap books and be able to take their new book home!


Dear 3B parents and carers,


