This week has been a busy one for the Catholic life of our school.

Saint of the week

This week's art work is Saint Elizabeth of Hungary. The art work was done by year 3 pupils at the end of last year. The children shared with us that Elizabeth had a privileged life but spent her time helping others, working with the poor and sick.



Ethos prayer and liturgy

On Monday, we began with our ethos prayer and liturgy, where we spoke about the message of Pope Francis' encyclical Fratelli Tutti (Brothers All) and how we can be our best selves in showing love for our neighbour's. Each class is thinking about the actions they can take in school, locally, and globally to show love for others.

Harvest Mass

On Tuesday, we celebrated our harvest mass in the church. The harvest loaf, kindly donated by Joe's bakery, was shared among all 400 of our children.



Gospel prayer and liturgy

Key Stage 2 gospel prayer and liturgy focused on the parable of the two brothers who were asked to work in the vineyard by their father. We discussed that actions are more important than words and talked about how we can 'walk the walk' this week.

In Key Stage 1 prayer and liturgy, we talked about God's messengers and how we can share love for others at school. The children are going to be sharing their love with others this week, so hopefully, it is something you will notice at home.

We are so proud of the way our children have embraced the Catholic values of love, compassion, and service this week. We look forward to seeing how they continue to 'walk the walk' and show love for their neighbours in the weeks to come.

6WA class assembly

This week, our Year 6 class assembly was about climate justice. They demonstrated that it is the countries that have the smallest carbon footprint that are most impacted by the effects of climate change.

Year 6 are sending messages and artwork to the government asking them to be good neighbours and support countries who need our help. We are really proud of our children for sharing such an important message.
