Trialling new lunch hall arrangements

You are probably aware of the new lunch hall arrangements we are trialling with the children at the moment.

At the end of last school year, the children told us that the lunch hall can often be too noisy and a bit too busy. Our parent carer group also feedback that many of you had noticed that your children were rushing to eat their packed lunch/ cooked meal in order to get outside and play. In school we could see that a lot of food was being wasted so we knew we had to do something.

As a result, we are trialling some new lunch table rules. Children are asked to come into the hall and sit with their year group at a table of 6 where they will eat lunch and then wait until they are finished. We are still in the early stages of making tweaks to this arrangement and are communicating and listening to the children over the trial period.

This arrangement is going to be reviewed on Monday with the children and we will update you next week, we assure you no changes will be made without explaining to the children beforehand.

For children who have high sensory needs we are continuing with their agreed arrangements.

NSPCC Speak Out, Stay Safe assemblies

I am pleased to inform you that we are participating in the NSPCC's *Speak out. Stay safe.* Programme this term. *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom-based activities which we have reviewed, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children in year 6. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. If you would like to know more about the *Speak out.
