Glide

Last year our Year 5 & 6 peer mediators used the GLIDE script to resolve conflicts at lunchtime. It was so successful we decided to roll it out for adults supervising children during play and lunch times to use. G- Greet (acknowledge both children, don't take sides)

- L- Listen (make sure both children are listened to in turn)
- I- Ideas (what could we do)
- D- Decide (together agree what must happen next)
- E- End (children might want to shake hands)

Give it a go at home, it's effective and empowering. In school it has helped children to independently resolve small issues.

Active listening

This year one of our school improvement plan priorities focuses on oracy. A significant part of this involves active listening.

This week in assembly I have spoken to the children about active listening. Why not give it a go at home!
