#### **Parent Focus Group**

#### **School Uniform Consultation**

Thank you to everyone who completed the recent school uniform consultation.

In total we received 67 responses.

70% of the parents/carers who engaged in the consultation stated the school meets the aims set out in the school uniform policy.

18% of parents/carers who engaged in the consultation stated the school does not meet the aims set out in the policy.

We have collated all of the comments you shared and have made the following recommendations: (changes are underlined for ease)

#### Main uniform:

- Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo. (This is the only part of the uniform that requires a logo)
- White or navy blue polo-shirt or shirt/blouse.
- Navy blue or grey trousers or shorts.

- Navy blue or grey skirt or pinafore dress. These should be knee length. Cycling shorts can be worn underneath in the summer.
- Blue checked dress/playsuit for the summer.
- Navy blue, grey or white tights.
- Navy blue, grey or white socks.
- Black school shoes, trainers or boots for winter.
- Sensible summer sandals, plain colour, can be worn in summer months. Socks must be worn with these.

PE kit: (to be worn to school on PE days)

- Plain white t-shirt (no branding/sports logo)...
- Navy blue shorts or skort in summer months (no branding/sports logo).
- Navy blue tracksuit bottoms/sports leggings in winter months (no branding/sports logo).
- Trainers.(These can be worn into school or brought in to school in a bag to change into. This is parental preference)

# Swimming kit:

Children in Years 2-6 attend swimming sessions. Children will need to have:

- One piece swimming costume or fitted swim shorts.
- Towel.
- Goggles (if children like to use them).
- Swimming cap.

Hair, Jewellery and accessories:

- No jewellery allowed except for a watch and only small, plain studs if children have pierced ears. These need to be covered with tape during PE.
- Watches to be analogue or digital. No smart watches. Fitbits are allowed.
- Dyed hair or shaved tramlines are not allowed.
- Nail varnish should not be worn in school.

#### Bags:

- Reception-Year 2 only, school book bag (with or without St Bonaventure's logo) and/or small rucksack.
- Years 3-6, pupils are encouraged to bring one rucksack that can hold all of the equipment they will need for their day.

We are currently investigating the introduction of iron on school logo badges which could be purchased by parents/carers and used on a plain sweatshirt/cardigan instead of a branded sweatshirt/cardigan. More information on this will follow in term 1-2 2023.

In addition, we received several comments about the expectation for all pupils to wear the uniform as set out in the policy. From September 2023 all staff will be reinforcing the school uniform to ensure it is consistent across the school.

The schools governing body is currently reviewing this policy along with the recommendations made. I will be in touch in September once the final policy has been agreed.

A few food pantry statistics for you this week: we've been running the food pantry for **16** months. In that time, we've done **57** shopping trips, spending an average of **£107.72** per shop.

Sadly, that £107 gets us much less for our money now than when we started the pantry in February 2022 because of the rise in food prices. Recently, we've had to slightly scale back on the amount and type of food we can offer in the pantry.

We know everyone is finding times tough, but we are completely dependent on your generosity to fund the pantry.
